Charlestown Township Seeks Resident Volunteers for Spring Roadside Clean-up & Other Earth Day Projects Saturday April 10, 2021 9 am – Noon (Rain Date April 17th)

Once again we seek volunteers to participate in a clean-up of selected township roads, parks and open space on April 10th. The Township will provide trash bags, gloves, safety vests and bottled water for volunteers. We will assign safer off-road areas for these groups and for families with younger children.



Who's in Your Pod? Due to COVID restrictions, most youth, business, and church groups won't be joining us this year, but household members and others in their own "pod" are encouraged to help out!

Litter patrol not for you? We can work with you or your group on planning a specific earth day project.

The Township Office will be open on Earth Day morning. Personnel will be on hand at the office and on the road throughout the event to handle calls, questions, problems, etc.

You may have a particular road or other area you'd like to take care of, otherwise we can suggest assignments and you can select one that appeals to you. You have the option of leaving the filled trash bags at the location for later pick up by the township, or if you have a truck or larger vehicle the bags can be dropped off at the Township yard opposite our office on Whitehorse Road.

Due to ongoing COVID restrictions, we won't be able to provide our usual continental breakfast fare at the office before heading out to your assignment. Instead, assignments for individuals, families, and other groups will be confirmed ahead of time, and clean up supplies can be picked up from the office by appointment up to 1 week before the event.
